<u>OPENING</u>: Spring and Summer of 2024 are gone as we have now moved into the Fall. The Friends of the Musketawa Trail board hopes that our readers/trail users are continuing to utilize and enjoy the trail. Our Friends group appreciates your continued support, interest in, and utilization of the trail! Please enjoy this newsletter with the latest news about the Musketawa Trail.

<u>Musketawa Trail Reconstruction News:</u> The latest on the Musketawa Trail rebuild comes from Jill Sell with the Michigan DNR. Jill stated:

"We are continuing to make good progress on the trail reconstruction project. We will be going out to bid late fall with a TBD project start date. Due to the extensive amount of work that needs to be done, we



had to narrow our project area in to match up with available funding. Our base bid will be for trail reconstruction work, including bridges, culverts, and trail paving, between the Marne trailhead and 40<sup>th</sup> St. We will also request pricing for the remaining work within Ottawa Coun-

ty from 40<sup>th</sup> St. to Squires Rd. if bids come in lower than expected or more funding becomes available."

The Michigan DNR plan is to rebuild the entire length of the Musketawa Trail. Jill and others continue to work on funding to complete the remaining section in Muskegon County. If you wish to contact Jill with any questions, she can be reached via email:

While waiting for the new pavement, the Michigan DNR got out and removed a bad surface section between Conklin and Marne. They put in limestone as a

substitute for the time being as repairing the area with patches wasn't feasible. We thank the DNR for their efforts to keep this small section "rideable".

We are in the initial stages of planning an event to say "goodbye" to the old/original pavement of the Musketawa Trail. Details such as dates and offerings are not finalized. Ideas include a "open" ride on the trail with Friends/volunteers staged at trail heads to offer t-shirts for sale and goodies. The event date(s) will be determined later as the trail rebuild timeline comes into focus. The event will likely be in two (2) parts as the Musketawa Trail is likely to be rebuilt in at least two (2) stages.

We will share event details in future news.

We continue to take donations for the Ed Holovka Memorial. The project will include a concrete pad, covered shelter, picnic table and bike repair station along the trail surface at the Muskegon/Broadway trail head.

Other Trail Update News: Lake Harbor Trail: Work has started on the Lake Harbor Trail in Norton Shores. When completed the Lake Harbor Trail will travel along the west side of Lake Harbor Road connecting Lake Harbor Park to Hoffmaster State Park. Tree clearing and trail sub-surface work has begun on the north end of this project near Lake Harbor Park and Maranatha.

**Pere Marquette Rail Trail:** The final 2.5 mile segment ("The Gap") connecting the two halves of the Pere Marquette Trail has been completed. This section that is west of Clare now allows the trail to extend between Baldwin and Midland, MI. The surface is all paved except the segment between Baldwin and Reed City (this section is limestone).
